SIMPLE	DEFINITION DEFINICIÓN Describe acciones que ocurrieron en algún momento del pasado una o varias veces.
	AFFIRMATIVE AFIRMATIVO Subject + Verb in past + Complement Michael worked yesterday. (Michael trabajó ayer.)
	NEGATIVE NEGATIVO Subject + Did + Not + Infinitive verb + Complement Michael <u>didn't</u> work yesterday. (Michael no trabajó ayer.)
	INTERROGATIVE INTERROGATIVO Did + Subject + Infinitive verb + Complement? <u>Did</u> Michael work yesterday? (¿Michael trabajó ayer?)

+ Sujeto + V. pasado + Complementos

Ej: I *went out* *when* I *finished* my homeworks
You *made* a mistake in the sentence

- Sujeto + did not (didn't) + V. base + Complementos

Ej: We *didn't watch* that interesting documentary *last night*
She *didn't study* for her exam, so she *failed* it

? [Wh- question] + Did + Sujeto + V. base + Complementos?

Ej: What *did* you *do* *last Monday*?
Did he *cook* this delicious dish?
